AGE.

- Voters, and persons elected as delegates, sheriffs, to be above twenty-one—Const. art. 2, 42.
- Male apprentices to be bound till the age of twenty-one, and females till the age of *eighteen*—1793, ch. 45, sec. 2, 4, 6, 295
- Females may be bound until the age of *eighteen*—1818, ch. 189, 697
- The contract to specify the age—1793, ch. 45, 295. 296
- Clerks appointed to enter the votes at elections to be above the age of twenty-one—1805, ch. 97, 517
- No person to be summoned as a juror under the age of twenty-five—1797, ch. 87, sec. 5, 349
- Letters testamentary, or of administration, shall not be granted to a person under *eighteen*—1798, ch. 101, sub ch. 4, sec. 1, p. 381; sub ch. 5, sec. 1, 322

AGENTS AND FACTORS.

- Persons entrusted for the purpose of consignment or sale, with any goods, &c. and who shall ship or consign the same in their own names, and persons in whose name goods, &c. shall be shipped or consigned by any other person; to be deemed the true owner thereof, so far as to entitle the consignee to a lien on such goods, &c. for advances made thereon, on certain conditions—1825, ch. 182, sec. 1, 851
- Persons entrusted with or in possession of bills of lading, store keepers or inspector's certificate, or order for the delivery of goods, &c.
