ASSAULT.

The house of delegates may punish, by imprisonment, any person who shall be guilty of a breach of privilege, by assaulting any of their members during their sitting, on their way to, or return from, the house, or by assaulting or obstructing their officers, or a witness, or any other person attending on, or on their way to or from the house—Const. art. 12.

The senate may exercise the same power on similar occasions—Const. art. 12.
