BANKRUPTS.

The commissioners of bankrupts in England entitled to their goods in the hands of factors here, not accounted for to their principal, and to an account thereof—1704, ch. 29, sec. 1,	4
The factors of such commissioners obliged first to give security to satisfy the debts contracted here by such bankrupts or their factors, after importation of such cargoes—1704, ch. 29, sec. 2,	5
No assignment, assurance, conveyance, deed, or any other writing whatsoever, of any goods, &c. executed by persons trading here, and residing in Great Britain, or elsewhere out of the (then) province at the time of executing the same, to be of any force till the person to whom such assignment was made, or his agent or attorney, should give bond to satisfy all debts due from such assignors, &c. to residents here, so far as the goods, &c. should come into his possession—1753, ch. 36, sec. 1,	102
