BILLS OF COST.

The clerks of courts of record, the register of the chancery court, and of the commissary's court, directed to deliver to defendants, if required, full copies of all costs recovered against them—1731, ch. 15, sec. 3, . . . . . 78

On refusal, to forfeit two thousand pounds of tobacco—1731, ch. 15, sec. 3, . . . . . 78

BILLS OF EXCHANGE.

On all bills of exchange hereafter drawn in this state on any person, corporation, &c. in a foreign country, and regularly protested, the person entitled thereto may recover

So much money as will purchase a good bill of the same time of payment, and on the same place, at the current exchange of such bill,

Fifteen per cent. damages on the value of the principal sum in the said bill,

Costs of the protest,

Legal interest on the principal from the time of the protest till the principal and damages are paid—1785, ch. 38, sec. 1, . . . . . 197

An endorser, paying to the person entitled the aforesaid value, damages and interest, may recover the sum paid, with legal interest upon the same, from the drawer or person, &c. liable—1785, ch. 38, sec. 1, . . . . . 197

Inland bills or orders, drawn by a citizen, company, &c. of any other of the United States, or any person residing or being therein, on any person, company, &c. of this state, or any person residing or being therein, shall be liable to official protest by a notary public, or the clerk of any county court, who are vested with authority to make such protests, under their respective seals of office—1785, ch. 38, sec. 2, . . . . . 198

On all bills of exchange or orders, hereafter drawn in this state, on any person, company, &c. in any other of the United States, and protested according to the laws or customs of the state where payable, the person entitled may recover—1785, ch. 38, sec. 2, . . . . . 198
