

Power of the chancellor respecting the persons and estates of idiots, lunatics, &c.—1785, ch. 72, sec. 6, p. 211; 1790, ch. 60, sec. 2, . . . 267

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Power of the chancellor respecting the recording of deeds not recorded agreeably to law—1785, ch. 72, sec. 10, 11, p. 213; 1791, ch. 79, p. 284; 1792, ch. 41, sec. 3, 287

The chancellor may direct the sale of lands, &c. in which an infant, idiot, or person non compos mentis, may have a joint interest, or interest in common with other persons, or where a contract has been made for such lands—1785, ch. 72, sec. 12, 214

Where a decree is made for a conveyance, release, or acquittance, and the party neglects or refuses to comply, such decree to have the same effect as if the conveyance, &c. had been executed agreeably to such decree—1785, ch. 72, sec. 13, 215

On commissions for taking testimony, the parties, and their attorneys or agents, have a right to be present, and to hear the interrogatories read, and to have copies of them before the examination of a witness—1785, ch. 72, sec. 14, 215

Power of the commissioners to adjourn—1785, ch. 72, sec. 14, 215

Allowance to the commissioners payable by the parties, and to be taxed as costs—1785, ch. 72, sec. 15, p. 216; 1818, ch. 193, sec. 3, 700

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The defendant may exhibit interrogatories to the plaintiff, which he shall answer in writing upon oath—1785, ch. 72, sec. 21, 219

Such answer shall be evidence to the same effect, &c. as the defendant's answer to the plaintiff's bill—1785, ch. 72, sec. 21, 219

The power and process shall be the same to compel an answer to such interrogatories by the plaintiff, as to compel an answer by the defendant to the plaintiff's bill—1785, ch. 72, sec. 21, 219

To enforce obedience to the process, &c. of the court of chancery, every person in contempt for disobedience, &c. shall, before he is released, pay to the register (to be accounted for by him,) a fine not exceeding £10, and be committed till the said process is obeyed and the fine paid—1785, ch. 72, sec. 22, 220

Sheriffs, coroners, &c. directed and authorized to execute any process
