- When any court, &c. shall order the publication of any notice, or other advertisement, in a newspaper, the court, &c. shall direct the place in which the notice, &c. shall be published, the number of papers, and the number of insertions, but shall not name the paper, but leave to the party to select the paper in which the same shall be inserted—1821, ch. 178, 880

ORPHANS COURT.

- The orphans courts or the chancery court empowered to decree or give directions to executors or administrators, with a copy of the will annexed, to retain the personal estate or a part thereof, after all claims are discharged whereby the will, money, or some other thing is directed to be paid, at a distant period or upon a contingency—1798, ch. 101, sub ch. 10, 11, 400

PARTIES.

- Upon appeals from the chancery court or county courts as courts of equity, where proper parties have not been made, court of appeals may reverse the decree or award a new trial, specifying in the order for a writ of procedendo, the parties to be made, &c.—1818, ch. 193, sec. 14, 701
- When a new party is made on the application of the opposite party, such new party may on appearance deny the matters alleged in the application, and where a new party is made on his own application, the opposite party may traverse the facts in the application—1821, ch. 161, sec. 7, 734

- Provision made for decreeing a partition of lands held by infants, idiots, &c. jointly with other persons—1794, ch. 60, sec. 8, 318
- Extended to infants residing out of the state, on answer being taken by commissioners to be appointed by the chancellor—1797, ch. 114, sec. 5, 358
- Extended to cases where all the persons reside out of the state—1818, ch. 193, sec. 11, 701
