

The power of courts of equity to decree sale of infants' estates, to extend to all cases of trusts, for infants, and to all such case of trusts concerning ground in the city of Baltimore—1835, ch. 380, sec. 9,	1224
In all cases in chancery where the answer of an infant defendant is filed, admitting the facts stated in the bill, or making no defence to the claim of claimant a commission may issue to such person, &c. as the court may direct, on the application of the complainant—1836, ch. 128, sec. 1,	1234
In cases where a commission ex parte is directed to be issued, complainant may take his testimony under the commission in chief—1836, ch. 128, sec. 2,	1234
In all issues of fact framed in the court of chancery, or county courts as courts of equity, &c. and sent to any county court for trial, upon suggestion and affidavit that a fair trial cannot be had, the court may order the issues to be sent to any other county court, &c.—1836, ch. 269,	1244

In any proceedings in courts of equity to foreclose any mortgage, &c. where an infant is interested, mortgagee, &c. need not give bond, &c.—1837, ch. 292,	1261

Shall have jurisdiction in all controversies between part owners of ships, vessels, schooners, or steamboats, with power to decree a sale of any ship, &c. held by part owners, and to apportion proceeds thereof between parties interested—1838, ch. 303,	1294
And in general, have and use such authority as, in cases of partnership—1838, ch. 303,	1294
But not in cases where any defendant is not resident of the county where the bill is filed—1838, ch. 303,	1294

CHESAPEAKE BAY.

Vessels prevented from anchoring on the fisheries at the head of the bay, unless by stress of weather—1807, ch. 114,	551
Persons committing crimes, &c. on Chesapeake bay, their aiders, &c. to be tried in the county where apprehended or first brought—1807, ch. 165, sec. 1,	560
Provision for removing the record, &c.—1807, ch. 165, sec. 2,	560
Punishment for stealing ships on the Chesapeake—1809, ch. 138, sec. 6,	577
If a person be feloniously stricken or poisoned on Chesapeake bay, and die within any county, or stricken in any county, and die on the Chesapeake bay, not within any county, the offender, &c. to be tried in the court where the death happened, or the stroke or poison was given—1809, ch. 138, sec. 18,	585
A person committing any crime, &c. on the Chesapeake bay, within the state, and not in any county, and all accessories, may be tried in any court having jurisdiction of the county in which he may be arrested or first brought—1809, ch. 138, sec. 19,	585
