Commissions to issue as chief judge of — judicial district, and in virtue thereof, judge of the court of appeals—1805, ch. 65, sec. 4, 501

 In case of his death, the next in seniority to be the chief judge, until a new appointment—1805, ch. 65, sec. 6, 501

 Not to act as an attorney or solicitor during the time he shall act as chief judge—1805, ch. 65, sec. 12, 503
 Each of the judges shall, out of court, have, use and exercise, all the jurisdiction and authority that might have been done by any judge of the late general court, of the former court of appeals, or by any chief justice of a district—1805, ch. 65, sec. 13, 503

CHILDREN, ILLEGITIMATE.

And their children, declared capable of inheriting both real and personal property from the mother, or from each other, or the descendants of each other in like manner, as if born in wedlock—1825, ch. 156, 835

CHOSSES IN ACTION.

The choses in action of a married woman, dying intestate, shall devolve on her husband without his administering—1798, ch. 101, sub ch. 5, sec. 8, 384
 If not reduced into possession, or judgment obtained for them in his life-time, they shall devolve on her representatives, and administration may be granted accordingly—1798, ch. 101, sub ch. 5, sec. 8, 384
 Mode of suing by the husband therefor—1798, ch. 101, sub ch. 5, sec. 9, 384
