

The judges of the levy courts shall appoint between the first Monday of April and of August, in every year, three persons as judges for each election district resident therein—1805, ch. 97, sec. 6,	515
Such persons, or a majority, (or one, in case of the non-attendance of the other two,) to be judges or judge of the election until a new appointment—1805, ch. 97, sec. 6,	515
To be conservators of the peace during the election, till the ballots are counted and certified—1805, ch. 97, sec. 6,	515
May commit offenders for breaches of the peace, as justices might—1805, ch. 97, sec. 6,	515
In case of death, resignation, &c. the levy courts to appoint others at any meeting thereafter—1805, ch. 97, sec. 6,	515
The county clerks to record every appointment and make out warrants 1805, ch. 97, sec. 6,	515
The warrants to be delivered within five days to the sheriffs, and by them, (within ten days,) to the persons appointed, or left at their last place of abode—1805, ch. 97, sec. 6,	515
Penalty on the clerks or sheriffs neglecting the said duty—1805, ch. 97, sec. 6,	515
Penalty on the judges not attending—1805, ch. 97, sec. 6,	515
In case neither of the judges attend for the space of one hour after the time directed, the justices of the county then present, or a majority authorized to choose three persons to be judges—1805, ch. 97, sec. 6,	515
Or one justice, if only one is present—1805, ch. 97, sec. 6,	515
If none present, the voters may choose three persons by ballot—1805, ch. 97, sec. 8,	515
The persons chosen to be vested with the same powers as if chosen by the levy courts—1805, ch. 97, sec. 8,	515
The judges to appoint two clerks above 21 years of age, to enter the names of the voters, who forfeit ten dollars for neglect or refusal—1805, ch. 97, sec. 10,	517
Oath or affirmation to be taken by every judge and clerk, and a certificate thereof to be annexed to the polls—1805, ch. 97, sec. 11,	517
The elections to commence at nine in the morning, and to continue without adjournment, and be closed at six in the evening of the same day—1805, ch. 97, sec. 12,	518
No ballot to be taken before the said hour of nine, nor after the said hour of six—1805, ch. 97, ch. 12,	518
Every voter to deliver to the judges a ballot, on which shall be written or printed the names of the persons voted for, and the purpose for which the vote is given—1805, ch. 97, sec. 12,	518
The ballots to be deposited in the box by the judges until the poll be closed—1805, ch. 97, sec. 12,	518
Penalty on judges or others unfolding or opening them with design to discover the names—1805, ch. 97, sec. 12,	518
Penalty on voters offering more than one ballot, with a fraudulent design—1805, ch. 97, sec. 12,	518
