FOREIGN PASSENGERS.

Masters of vessels from foreign countries or any other of the United States, arriving at the port of Baltimore, to report to the mayor, &c. under penalty of twenty dollars for each passenger—1832, ch. 303, sec. 1,	1096
To pay to the mayor, &c. one dollar and fifty cents for each passenger, or to give bond to indemnify the authorities from all charge, penalty upon failure one hundred dollars—1832, ch. 303, sec. 2,	1096
If master suffers any alien passenger to land within fifty miles of the city shall pay one dollar and fifty cents, or give bond or forfeit one hundred dollars—1832, ch. 303, sec. 3,	1096
