Page.

This act not to extend to free negroes or mulattoes, who, from old age or infirmity, are unable to support themselves by labour—1825, ch. 161, sec. 3,* 838

Levy courts to make such provisions as may be necessary for such old and infirm negroes, &c.—1825, ch. 161, sec. 4, 838

Not lawful for persons to purchase from any free negro or mulatto any quantity of tobacco, under a penalty of \$100, for every offence, to be recovered by indictment in the county court, unless such negro, &c. shall produce a certificate from a justice of the peace certifying the quantity, &c.—1825, ch. 199, sec. 1, 858

May be sentenced to confinement in the penitentiary—1826, ch. 229, sec. 8, 894

After the expiration of the term of any of them, or pardon, the directors to pay him or her not exceeding thirty dollars, and he or she shall be banished the state, and if found in the state after sixty days, to be apprehended and sold as a slave, for the term of his or her original conviction, &c.—1826, ch. 229, sec. 9, 894

The 2d section of the act of 1828, ch. 98, which provides that when a negro or mulatto shall be committed to jail, under the acts relative to the apprehension of runaways, the expenses of such commitment to be certified to the treasurer, and paid by him, repealed—1831, ch. 185, 1022

Governor to appoint a board of managers, to remove from this state the people of colour now free, or such as shall become so hereafter, to Liberia, or such other place out of the state as they may approve, and the persons to be removed shall consent to—1831, ch. 281, sec. 1, 1035

Managers to give bond, &c.—1831, ch. 281, sec. 1, 1035

Treasurer of the western shore to pay to the board of managers from time to time as may be required, a sum not exceeding \$20,000, &c.—1831, ch. 281, sec. 2, 1035

Clerks of courts and registers of wills to furnish the board of managers with copies of deeds of manumission when left for record, penalty of \$10 for every omission. Board of managers to notify colonization society of such manumission, and to propose removal to Liberia—1831, ch. 281, sec. 3, 1036

If the society agree to remove, the managers to deliver such persons to the agent of the society—1831, ch. 281, sec. 3, 1036

If the society refuse to receive or the persons refuse to be removed, managers to select some other place—1831, ch. 281, sec. 3, 1036

In case of refusal to be removed beyond the limits of the state, managers to notify the sheriff, who shall arrest such person, &c. and transport the same beyond the limits of the state—1831, ch. 281, sec. 3, 1036

All slaves declared capable of receiving manumission for the purpose of removal with consent—1831, ch. 281, sec. 3, 1036
