Punishment for raising or conspiring to raise—1809, ch. 138, sec. 2,	573
In case of invasion, insurrection, &c. any officer may order the un- formed or drafted corps under his command in service, but no mili- tia officer other than the commander-in-chief may order out any portion of the militia unless required to do so, if in Baltimore city, by the mayor or one of the judges of the city court, or chief judge of the county court in writing, or if in any county by two justices of the peace, under their hands and seals, &c.—1834, ch. 151, sec. 57,	1175
In case of insurrection or opposition to the laws of Baltimore city, the mayor or chief or associate justices of the city or county courts may issue requisition, &c. to order out the Baltimore City Guards —1835, ch. 14, sec. 9,	1605
