The clerk of the senate and house of delegates to furnish the printer of the state with a correct copy of their votes and proceedings, and the several laws and resolutions, passed at each session, within thirty days therefrom, and to take a receipt therefor—1790, ch. 51, sec. 2,	262
The printer directed to print the said laws, &c. in the manner and to the number therein mentioned, and deposit them, (packed up, sealed and directed,) in the council chamber, with the clerk of the council, within sixty days from the receipt of the original copies, and to take a receipt therefor, under the penalty of £50, and the forfeiture of his allowance or salary as printer to the state—1790, ch. 51, sec. 3,	262
Bond to be given within fifteen days after the close of each annual session, in the penalty therein prescribed—1816, ch. 98, sec. 3,	640
