

STOCKS.

- Subjecting stocks to attachment and execution for debt—manner of proceeding, &c.—1832, ch. 307, 1101
- Any person forging or counterfeiting any certificate of stock of the state, to be deemed guilty of felony—1834, ch. 279, 1181
- Providing an easy mode for transferring them, when held by non-residents—1839, ch. 336, 2347

STOVES.

- Stoves in the hands of persons hiring or renting them, exempt from taxation, execution for distress for rent, provided the contract for renting, be in writing and acknowledged before a justice of the peace—1834, ch. 180, sec. 1, 1140
- Justice's fee for taking acknowledgment, twelve cents—1834, ch. 180, sec. 2, 1140
- Act of 1816, ch. 210, repealed—1834, ch. 180, sec. 3, 1140

SUBMISSION.

- On pleading guilty and submission in a trial for a misdemeanor, the court may order that no compensation for attendance of the prosecutor be allowed—1809, ch. 138, sec. 24, 587
- On presentment or indictment a submission to the court not to be considered as admitting the fact, or charging the person with the costs—1809, ch. 144, 589

SURVEYORS.

- To be appointed by the governor and council—Const. art. 48.
- Every surveyor, before he acts as such, shall take an oath, that he will not, directly or indirectly, receive any fee or reward for doing his office but what is or shall be allowed by law, nor will, directly or indirectly, receive the profits, or any part of the profits, of any office held by any other person, and that he does not hold the same office in trust, or for the benefit of any other person—Const. art. 52.
- Punishment for their so receiving the profits—Const. art. 53.
- Surveyors' fees established—Nov. 1779, ch. 25, 151
- Where any surveyor returns a certificate for the examination of the examiner-general, and the same shall be by him found erroneous, the party for whose use the survey is made, shall not be burthened with any fees on such erroneous certificate, either by the examiner-general or surveyor, but the surveyor returning such erroneous certificate shall pay the examiner-general for his trouble in examining
