

TRESPASS.

See *Limitation of Action*.

Actions of trespass quare clausum fregit not to abate by the death of either party—1801, ch. 74, sec. 38, 463

In actions of trespass quare clausum fregit special bail may be awarded by the court, on affidavit of the plaintiff, or other evidence, of the defendant not being a citizen or a resident of this state—1812, ch. 94, 610

Trespass for destroying or carrying away timber, &c. from land, where the damage does not exceed \$50, may be tried by a justice of the peace—1813, ch. 162, sec. 1, 622

See *Justices, title 'Small Debts.'*

If any person shall cut down any timber or tree, of a size used as hoop-poles, with intent to steal the same, he and his aiders, &c. shall be guilty of felony, and shall be punished, &c.—1826, ch. 260,* 918

Any person aggrieved by trespass upon his enclosures by cattle, hogs or sheep, may impound them, cause them to be valued, advertise and sell—1832, ch. 157, 1079

Many of the counties have withdrawn from the operation of this law.

UNITED STATES.

Any of the United States shall be recognized in this state a body politic and corporate, for the purpose of prosecuting actions against any person residing in this state, on some citizen of this state being answerable for costs—1785, ch. 36, 197
