For summoning jury of inquest, for each person summoned 12½ cts. For serving attachment for contempt, 50 cts. For levying distress for rent to be paid by the party distraining, unless in cases where the property had been removed from the premises, \$1 25. For summoning and swearing appraisers on distress for rent, 33½ cts.

Penalty for receiving greater fee than allowed.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That if any constable shall take or receive, either directly or indirectly, any greater fee or reward than what is allowed by this act for such services, he shall forfeit the sum of one hundred dollars for every such offence, one-half to go to the school funds of the several counties of this state, and the other half to the informer thereof, to be recovered in the county court of the county where the offence shall be committed, or the city court of Baltimore, if in the city of Baltimore, by bill of indictment.

CHAPTER 166.

AN ACT to continue in force the Acts of Assembly which would expire with the present session.

Acts continued.

Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all such acts, and parts of such acts of assembly, as would expire with the present session of assembly, be and the same are hereby continued until the twentieth day of November next, and to the end of the next session of assembly which shall happen thereafter.

Deeds conveying any estate of inheritance, &c. to have effect, &c.

Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all deeds heretofore made, or hereafter to be made, for conveying or passing any estate of inheritance or freehold, or declaring or limiting any use or uses, trust or trusts, or for conveying any estate for above seven years, and which have been or shall
