

It was decided in the affirmative, and the bill was referred.

The bill entitled an Act providing for the appointment of Inspectors of Lime for the City of Baltimore,

Being upon a third reading,

Mr. Poteet (by unanimous consent,) submitted the following amendment:

Section 15. *And be it enacted*, That one of the Inspectors appointed under this Act shall remain at the lime sheds each and every day from sunrise to sunset, except on Sundays.

Which was adopted.

The bill as amended was then read a third time and rejected for want of a constitutional majority, by yeas and nays as follows:

On motion of Mr. Morse,
