

Said bill was then returned to the Senate.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal, amend and reenact section four, chapter 152, of an Act passed March 21st, 1867, entitled an Act to appropriate \$100,000 for the relief of the destitute people in the States wasted by civil war,
