Ordered, That the Postmaster of the House of Delegates furnish each member with postage stamps to the amount not exceeding forty dollars, (\$40,) and each of the officers of the House with an amount not exceeding five dollars, except the Chief Clerk, Reading Clerk and Journal Clerk, who shall be entitled to the same amount as members; and that any member or officer may elect to take and use said stamps
