105th. Page 47, Sources of Income, section 2, after the word "adopted," in line 4, strike out all to the end of line 5.

106th. Section 4, line 3, page 48, strike out "State Board of Education," and insert Board of County School Commissioners.

The amendments were severally read and adopted.

*Colored Population.*

Amendment proposed :

106½. Page 47, section 1. The total amount of taxes paid for school purposes by the colored people of any county or in the city of Baltimore, together with any donations that may be made for the purpose shall be set aside for the maintaining the schools for colored children, which schools shall be conducted under the direction of the Board of County School Commissioners or the Board of Commissioners of Public Schools of the city of Baltimore, and shall be subject to such rules and regulations as said respective boards shall prescribe.

Mr. Bowlus moved the previous question, which was sustained.

Shall the previous question be now put ?
