Decided in the negative.

The question then recurring upon the order submitted by Mr. Brown,

It was adopted.

On motion of Mr. Syester,

Leave was granted to the Washington and Allegany delegations to introduce a bill to require the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Washington county, to prepare and make a general index of the land records of Washington county, and to transcribe one of the equity dockets of said court.

On motion of Mr. Montague,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to abolish the usury laws of this State.

On motion of Mr. Nicolai,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations (to be hereafter appointed) to report a bill to amend the charter of the Baltimore and Yorktown Turnpike company.

On motion of Mr. Syester,

Leave was granted to the Washington and Allegany county delegations to introduce a bill regulating the time and manner of holding the courts in Washington county, and to repeal and re-enact certain sections of the code of public local laws.

On motion of Mr. Bond, of Baltimore city,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to repeal certain sections of article 35 of the code of public general laws relating to "elections," and to re-enact the same with amendments.
