Strike out sections 66 and 67, and substitute the following in lieu thereof:

And be it enacted, That no provisions of this Act shall take effect until the first Tuesday of May, in the year 1869.

Which was adopted.

The bill as amended,

Was then read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
