Said bill was then returned to the Senate.

The Speaker laid before the House the following report of the Comptroller of the Treasury, in response to an order of the House:

Hon. Wm. A. Stewart, Speaker of the House of Delegates:

SIR:—In obedience to the order of your Honorable Body of this date, I have the Honor to submit the following report:

It is impossible to ascertain from the files of this office the number of slaves enlisted between April 1st, and November 1st, 1864.

A careful examination of the records here show the number of claims filed for enlisted slaves during this period to be as follows, to wit: Owners' claims 79, of which number 43 were paid. Number of claims for slaves enlisted or drafted 91, of which number 27 were paid.
