Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That no citizen of Frederick, Carroll or Baltimore counties, shall be permitted to shoot, trap or in any manner catch, any partridge, pheasant, woodcock or wild turkey, within the limits of any part of this State, excepted from the operations of this Act, under the pains and penalties prescribed in the 1st Section.

Which was read.
