So the motion submitted by Mr. Mullin was decided in the affirmative.

And the vote by which the bill was rejected was reconsidered.

On motion of Mr. Mullin,

The vote by which the Senate amendments were adopted, was reconsidered.

The question then recurring upon the adoption of the amendments, they were rejected.

Mr. Mullin submitted the following message:

By the House of Delegates,

March 30, 1868.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We have received the bill entitled an Act to legalize a supplement to the Maryland Code containing the Acts of the General Assembly passed at the sessions of 1861, 1861-62, 1864, 1865, 1866, and 1867, arranged in Articles and sections to correspond with the Code by Lewis Mayer, and to appropriate a sum of money to purchase copies of the same, and to regulate their distribution, with proposed amendments, and decline to concur therein. We respectfully ask a committee of conference, to consist of one member on the part of the Senate and two members on the part of the House. We have named on the part of the House Messrs. Mullin and Slingluff.
