the House passed on the 16th inst., respectfully report that they have had the same under consideration, and, after the best reflection they could give the subject, fail to perceive why such a bill as is contemplated by said order would not fall within the prohibition contained in section 59 of the 3d Article of the Constitution, which declares "the Legislature shall pass no law establishing any general pension system within this State." Such a law would, in the opinion of your committee, be clearly unconstitutional and void.

They therefore respectfully ask to be discharged from the further consideration of the aforesaid order.
