Also leave to report a bill to amend the charter of the

Liberty and Johnsville Turnpike.

Leave was granted to the Baltimore county delegation to introduce a bill to allow the Commissioners of Baltimore county to make additional precincts in such Districts as require them.

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to amend the Sunday law.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to amend the charter of the corporation of Havre-de-Grace.
