The question upon the adoption of the substitute was determined in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Denson, it was

Ordered, That the officers of the late Senate, who have attended the present session of the Senate, and assisted in its organization, and have not been re-appointed to office, be paid for eight days attendance, and mileage at the usual rates.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the follow-

ing message, which was read.

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES,

January 3, 1868.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We have received your message informing us of the organization of your Honorable Body. The House of Delegates has organized by the election of Hon. Wm. A. Stewart, as Speaker, and the appointment of Milton Y. Kidd, of Cecil County, as Chief Clerk.

We are now ready to proceed to the business of the session, and concur with your Honorable Body in the appointment of a joint committee to wait upon His Excellency, the Governor, and inform him that the General Assembly is prepared to receive any communication he may be pleased to make.

The Senate reconsidered the vote on the adoption of the order in relation to the per diem of the officers of the late Senate.

Mr. Denson then submitted the following amendment:

Strike out the words "mileage at the usual rates."

On the question being put, it was determined in the affirmative.

The question then recurred upon the adoption of the order as amended, and it was determined in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Snyder, it was

Ordered, That when the Senate adjourn it stands adjourned until Monday morning at 12 o'clock.
