The Senate went into executive session.

After a short session,

On motion by Mr. Earle,

The doors were opened, and the Senate resumed its usual business.

Mr. Grove presented letters in reference to a mute in Washington county ;

Which were referred to the Committee on Finance.

The House bill entitled an Act to repeal the 53d, 54th, 55th, 56th and 57th sections of Article 19 of the Public Local Law of Somerset county, relating to fences; was reported favorably from the select committee, and read the second time.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow at 11 A. M.
