Resolved, by the General Assembly of Maryland, that the Senators and Representatives from this State, in the Congress of the United States, are hereby requested to urge upon that body the passage of such laws as honor, justice, and the true policy of the country demands, in fully securing to the naturalized citizen the same rights of person and property, both at home and abroad, which are now possessed by the native born.

Resolved, That a copy of the above resolution be forwarded by the proper officer to each of our Senators and Representatives in Congress.
