Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings to introduce a bill to prevent tenants from committing waste upon the property of their landlords.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to report a bill to repeal section 165 of Article 19, of the Code of Public Local Laws for Somerset county, title Salisbury, and the supplement thereto, and to re-enact the same with amendments, so as to form a new section to Article 23 of the Code of Public Local Laws entitled Wicomico county.

Leave was granted to Senators Walsh, Welch, and Denson to introduce a bill relating to liabilities of keepers of hotels or ordinaries.
