School Report—8,000 copies in English and 2,000 copies in German, to be divided as follows: \(\frac{1}{3}\) of the 10,000, or 3,333, for use of the Senate; \(\frac{2}{3}\) of the 10,000, or 6,667, for use of the House of Delegates, which will allow to each Senator 133 copies, and to each member of the House of Delegates 77 copies; cost of copy of said report 46\(\frac{2}{3}\) cents.
