Marylander can look upon with pride and satisfaction. Its healthfulness of location is beyond a doubt, being both elevated and dry, and the price for such a property, \$29,000, is a most reasonable one, particularly when its size, containing about two acres, in the very centre of the city, and the large quantity of material upon it, which can be made useful, is taken into consideration. For the above reasons we respectfully recommend an appropriation of \$29,000, for the purchase of the property above referred to.
