Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill entitled an Act to incorporate the Trustees of the Free Seat Methodist Episcopal Church of Annapolis, and to make valid certain deeds heretofore made to them.

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to report an Act to enable the vestry of St. Thomas' P. E. Church to hold money in trust for certain religious and charitable purposes connected with the P. E. Church in America, or with said parish.
