On motion by Mr. Earle,

The vote by which Senate bill entitled an Act to prohibit the granting of license for the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer at or near Newark, in Worcester county, in the State of Maryland,

was rejected, was reconsidered, and, on his motion, it was ordered that the bill lie on the table.

By the Senate, January 31, 1868.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

We have received your message proposing that the joint committee already appointed to visit and examine into the condition of all the benevolent and reformatory institutions which are beneficiaries of the State, be authorized and directed to visit and examine into the condition of all such benevolent and charitable institutions which have applied, or may during this session apply to the General Assembly for relief, or may request said committee to make such visit and examination, and concur therein.

And on the question being put, the motion was rejected.
