## SATURDAY, February 1, 1868.

The Senate met pursuant to adjournment.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Hammond.

On motion by Mr. Clarke,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Finance to introduce a bill to regulate and provide for the collecting of taxes in Baltimore county.

On motion by Mr. Walsh, it was

Ordered, That the President be requested to appoint some suitable person to assist the Janitor in cleaning up and keeping the Senate Chamber and Committee Rooms in proper condition, the pay of such officer not to exceed two dollars per day.
