Sir: In answer to an order passed by your Honorable Body, requesting information from this office of "the number of men furnished the Federal Government for military service by the State of Maryland to fill her quotas for the years 1861, 1862, and 1863, up to the 18th day of October of said last year," I have the honor to report, that for calls for troops, made by the Federal Government in the years 1861, 1862 and 1863, the State of Maryland has credits thus:
