House bill entitled an Act to enable the Vestry of Saint Thomas Parish in Baltimore county, to hold money in trust for certain religious and charitable purposes, connected with the Protestant Episcopal Church in America, or with said Parish.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to incorporate a company to be called the "Wando Company."

On motion by Mr. Welch,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Welch, Earle, and Hyland to report a bill to repeal sections four and five of the Act passed the 8th day of March, 1856, chapter 148, entitled "an Act to incorporate the Kent county Railroad Company" and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to incorporate "The Agricultural and Mechanical Association of Washington county.
