Mr. Malone presented the petition of sundry citizens of Worcester county against the passage of the law dividing an election district in the county.

Which was referred to the Senators from Worcester, Somerset and Wicomico.

Mr. Henkle presented the petition from the Eleventh School District of Anne Arundel county for a law prohibiting the sale of liquors in said district.

Which was referred to the Committee on Education.

Ordered, that the Committee on Finance be instructed to return to the Senate House bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments sections 33, 34, 35, 39 and 75 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Revenues and Taxes," &c.
