

The power and authority to appoint the road supervisors, and also to have charge of and control over the public roads in the several counties, certainly and of necessity carries with it the power to prescribe the time, manner and by whom the taxes shall be expended, otherwise it would be impossible properly to execute the law.

Your Committee, therefore, are fully convinced that the powers conferred by existing laws are quite sufficient for all the probable necessities of any of the counties, and, consequently, that no further legislation is expedient or necessary, and we respectfully ask to be discharged from a further consideration of the subject.
