Mr. Blake submitted the following order:

Ordered, That the Committee appointed by this House, in conjunction with a similar Committee from the Senate, to examine into the condition of the Maryland Penitentiary Buildings, be also required to examine the books and accounts of the institution, as is the usual custom.
