to fill the quotas of Maryland, under the call of the President of the United States of the 19th December, 1864, and under future calls, by amending and re-enacting sections 4, 5 and 6, which were repealed or intended to be repealed by the Act of 1867, chapter 156,

Was ordered to lie over.

Mr. Clarke, from the Committee on Printing, reported favorably

House bill entitled an Act to repeal the Act of 1864, chapter 405, relating to the establishment of a uniform system of contracting for public printing.

Which was read the second time.

Senate bill entitled a further supplement to an Act entitled an Act to incorporate the Baltimore and Cuba Smelting and Mining Company, passed at December session, 1844,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion by Mr. Clarke,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings to introduce a bill granting further time to Joseph Walker, late Sheriff of Baltimore county, to complete and close up his business as Sheriff of said county.

On motion by Mr. Hammond,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Education to introduce a bill to amend section 3, chapter 123, of the laws of 1867, title "School House sites," and "sources of income."

Senate bill entitled an Act to incorporate the Cecil Land and Loan Company,
