Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal chapter 156, passed January session, 1867, entitled an Act to repeal sections 5 and 8 of an Act passed January session, 1864, chapter 15, entitled an Act to aid and encourage enlistments into the Maryland regiments in the service of the United States, and also to repeal sections 4 and 5 of an Act passed January session, 1865, chapter 33, entitled an Act to provide bounty for soldiers entering the service of the United States to fill the quotas of Maryland, under the call of the President of the United States of December, 1864, and under future calls,

Was taken up, and

Mr. Earle moved the following amendment:

Amend section 1, line 10, insert the word "eighteen" after the word "nineteenth."

Which was adopted.
