to fill the quotas of Maryland, under the call of the President of the United States of the 19th December, 1864, and under future calls, by amending and re-enacting sections 4, 5 and 6, which were repealed or intended to be repealed by the Act of 1867, chapter 156,

Being upon its second reading,

Mr. Clarke moved to recommit the bill to the Committee on Finance.
