Mr. Carroll offered the following amendments:

1st. No pilot shall charge, or receive any compensation for his services in piloting any steamer, steamship or vessel propelled by steam, or vessel in tow of a steam tug or tugs, employed by said vessel, from Baltimore to Cape Henry, and vice versa, trading regularly from the port of Baltimore, coastwise or foreign, beyond sixty-six and two-thirds per cent. of the regular rates established by this Act, under a penalty of forfeiture of one-half of the amount demanded, and in violation of this section.

- 2d. Whenever any vessel shall have passed inside of Cape Henry, and bound to Baltimore, and wanting a pilot, without having been spoken by a pilot outside of the Cape, the pilot shall not charge more than one-half of regular rates established by this Act, and shall be obliged to render service, or forfeit his service.
- 3d. Whenever a vessel shall be run ashore when in charge of a pilot, unless there shall be palliating circumstances shown, then the pilot in charge shall forfeit his license in the discretion of the Board of Examiners.

Which amendments were rejected.
