The second reading of the Senate bill of Drafts of Laws on Cooperations was continued from the 76th section.

Mr. Henkle offered the following amendments:

Amend in 7th line, sec. 107, by inserting after the word "County," the word "Road."

Amend sec. 107, by inserting after the words "Stone or gravel," the words "or other hard or durable material."

Amend section 107, after the words "twelve inches," insert "unless the natural bed be hard."

Amend sec. 120, Amend by adding at the end of the section: "Making due allowance always for cost of necessary repairs, and reconstruction from accident or otherwise."
