Leave was granted to the Committee on Finance, to report a bill to pay Dr. M. C. Parker and others, bounty for certain slaves therein mentioned.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Finance to report a bill to pay to James S. Morsell, Jr., bounty for a negro-slave therein mentioned.

On motion by Mr. Fields,

Leave was granted to the Senators from Caroline, Talbot and Somerset, to introduce a bill to authorize the Clerk of the Circuit Conrt for Caroline county, to purchase a suitable book in which to index the land records in said county.

On motion by Mr. Fields,

Leave was granted to the Senators from Caroline, Baltimore and Kent, to introduce a bill entitled an Act to amend Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, by adding thereto the following sections relating to the inspection of Guanos, other than Peruvian and of artificial, manufactured or manipulated manures.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings to introduce a bill to amend the Act passed at January session, 1867, chapter 329, entitled an Act relating to the drawing and summoning Jurors to the several Circuit Courts of the various counties, and to re-enact the same with an amendment.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations, to introduce a bill to incorporate the Baltimore and Swanns Lake Passenger Rail Road Company.
