

Senate bill entitled an Act to extend the time limited by the Act of 1867, chapter 189, section 6, for producing and perpetuating the evidence of the ownership of slaves, so far as the same relates to citizens of Dorchester county,

Was read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Senate bill entitled an Act to amend the 18th Article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Clerks of Courts, by adding a section thereto, imposing an additional duty on the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas, in regard to public money received by him,

Was read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal section 810 of Article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the city of Baltimore, and chapter 367, passed at the January session, 1867, and re-enact the same with amendments,

Senate bill entitled an Act to incorporate the Baltimore and North Point Turnpike Road Company,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Senate bill entitled an Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Frederick and Baltimore counties to aid in constructing turnpike roads in their respective counties,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
