The Joint Resolutions authorizing an appropriation for a portrait of Governor Thomas Swann,

Were read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Joint Resolutions in relation to Governor Swann's statement in his message of services rendered to the State of Maryland by the Honorable Secretary of the Navy,

Being upon a second reading,
