Senate bill entitled an Act to amend Article 51 of the Code of Public General Laws, in relation to Justices of the Peace, by adding thereto the following sections, with following amendments:

Amend section 66 by striking out in line 7 all the remainder of said section after the word kill.

Amend section 67 in line 2 by adding after the word counties the words in civil cases.

Amend section 68 in line 2 by striking out all in said line after the word case, and amend line 3 of same section by striking out the words for assault and battery and larceny, and the word charged at the end of said line, and insert the words to said cause.

Amend section 74, line 7, by striking out all after the word rendered in said line to the end of said section.
